The first Temple built was constructed by King Solomon in the year 980 BCE. The Bible's description of Solomon's Temple was that it was 180 feet long, 90 feet wide and 50 feet high. I think that this building is larger. No expense was spared in the building's creation, the cedars came from Lebanon. The choicest stones were quarried. Forced labor did the work. Solomon went into significant debt. We are more fortunate or have less borrowing power, take your choice! The Temple was not a spiritual place by today's standards. It was a slaughter house for animals to be sacrificed.

That Temple was eventually destroyed by the Babylonians in 586 BCE. The second Temple was built by the Hebrews who returned from exile in 520 BCE. Notice I did not say Jews—that term came into existence in the 3rd Century BCE. However, under Herod, the Temple was expanded in a magnificent manner. That too was eventually destroyed by the Romans in 70 CE. The Western wall in Jerusalem is a remnant of that Temple.

Generation to Generation

It was wonderful to see the youngsters at the dedication ceremony. With the building of our own home, there has been much excitement from young families who are looking forward to having their children Bar & Bat Mitzved in our sanctuary. It was a great joy to see the young children roaming around our sanctuary during the dedication service—such bright faces! They are our future.

High Holy Day Services

This bulletin is being written before the High Holidays but will be sent out during the Holidays. Thus I would like to thank those who participated in the services ahead of time. I know that the readers will be inspirational, the choir and Michael Linder will touch our hearts and the congregational members will be respectful. And I do know that the acoustics are awesome. 5766 is a new beginning of our future.

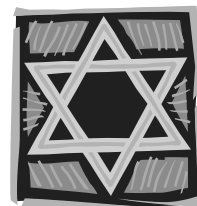

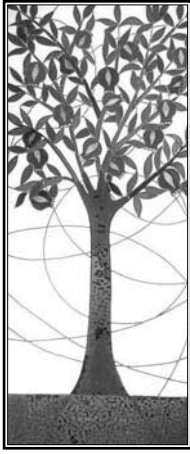

New Mexico Jews in War & Peace

The cost of attending is \$75 for members and \$100 for non-members. This will include lectures, Friday evening dessert reception, Saturday evening dinner and Sunday Lox and Bagel Brunch.

Albuquerque, La Posada Hotel will be the site of the 2005 Annual Conference of the NMJHS. This year's theme is "New Mexico Jews in War and Peace" and features the participation of historians, as well as veterans of the armed forces and the peace demonstrations of the 1960s and 1970s.

The conference will begin Friday evening with a dessert reception and a screening of a video produced by NMJHS member, Jim Terr, "In Their Own Words: Twelve Veterans of World War Two," which includes interviews with Leah Kellogg, who served as a nurse at the Brunns Hospital, now the College of Santa Fe, during the War. The evening's program will conclude in time to allow those who wish to attend Shabbat services at one of the local synagogues.
